

Mord From Par MNSTER

There is so much about advent that doesn't make sense. There is a lot about Christianity that seems to not make sense. Why would Jesus come in such abased conditions, to so little recognition, amid such insignificant circumstances? How can the Christianity begun by Jesus offer hope, peace and joy when our world, and the people in it are often in turmoil? How can we hope for change, for better things, and a coming Kingdom of peace amidst the wars, economic gloom and upheaval in our world? If we have ever felt or struggled with that tension, as I often do myself, I think ironically it brings us closer to the heart of the advent season (meaning Jesus' arrival), and indeed Christmas. The struggle and tension is where

God meets us, and plants faith in our weakened hearts. It is where he desires to work, and give us hope beyond reason.

I've been reflecting on our opening advent passages this year, particularly on Psalm 122 which has these lovely words:

"For the sake of my family and friends, I will say, 'Peace be within you.' For the sake of the house of the

Lord our God,

I will seek your prosperity."

The psalmist envisions a community of faith-filled people where grace has been shared amongst them, because they have encountered God. We often celebrate the coming of our Lord at Christmas as the arrival of the 'Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6).

I believe we are called to be just such a community at this time, to our darkened world. We saw so many glimmers of that light and peace already this year at our hugely successful Christmas Fayre. It was not only an event to raise church funds, which are so much needed, but a chance to proclaim God's peace, love and goodwill to our community which is precious to us.

We are in a challenging season. Our church finances are challenging and future uncertain. That could be merely dark and gloomy if we allow it to be. But, Christ came as light to a dark world at Christmas. With faith in Him, and faithfulness to His call to keep being light and blessing to our community, I believe we can keep

responding together in generosity, and seeking the prosperity of our church, our whole community, our brothers and sisters and their families. We can keep working together 'For the sake of the house of the Lord', and trust that with all our efforts, God will bring the prosperity, the hope of better days, and of course the continued work of the Gospel of His dear Son where we are.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding has been an important part of the Church of Scotland since the Cullen enquiry into the tragic shootings at Dunblane Primary. As a result of this, all churches in the Church of Scotland set up procedures to ensure our children were protected & was later extended to include vulnerable adults. All churches were instructed to appoint a Safeguarding coordinator and panel to manage all aspects of Safeguarding. EPC appointed Anne Thomson and Stuart Boyne as coordinators, and Elizabeth McDade and Irene Downie to help ensure our church is a safe environment for all. The role of the coordinators is to process PVG (Protection of Vulnerable Groups) applications, which allows the Safeguarding Service in Edinburgh to ascertain whether a person may have a


conviction that would prevent them from working with groups in the church. This year we have seen changes to the legislation about PVG. It is now mandatory for everyone in Scotland working with young people or protected adults to have a PVG. From April 2026, everyone working with children or a protected adult will require an update every five years.

We are fortunate to have panel members who are committed and supportive in safeguarding the people we serve. Although it is the role of the panel to manage Safeguarding, every church member has a role in ensuring a safe place for all and if you have any concerns, please speak to a panel member.

The opportunity for EPC to bring about change is here!

Our Youth ministry will explore and experiment with new forms of church for a changing culture and in doing so, connect with young people who do not currently come to church. We also want to take a fresh approach to Christian ministry by using new technology to share the Gospel in a way that is relevant to our times.

See I am doing a new thing. ~Isaiah 43:19

The truth of Isaiah 43:19 still stands for us today. Many young people, especially since the pandemic, struggle to find hope and encouragement for the future in a world that continues to be riddled by corruption, disaster and division. This isn't too far off how the people of Israel were during the time of Isaiah's prophecy. Our ministry hopes to disciple young people by providing opportunities and

see what God does in and through them. In this pathway, ministry settings geared for one stage provide a golden opportunity to issue an invitation to the next. By connecting with young people and getting them through the "door" of our youth ministry we can hopefully engage with them, meet them where they are and encourage them to find something that helps make sense of the confusing world they live in. In time, hopefully some of these young people will be ready to make a profession of faith. As previously intimated we have secured funding from Church of Scotland, Seeds for Growth Fund and we have recently also secured a grant for this project from the Bishop Radford Trust. We are in the process of applying to other funders.

The Kirk Session approved a recruitment programme for a Youth Outreach worker and this full-time position will be

advertised in January 2026 with an appointment being made in March. The contract will initially be for one year with the possibility of extending it to three years if additional funding can be obtained.

Finance & Governance

The 2024 Accounts and Annual Report are on the church website. Paper or electronic copies are available on request from any office bearer.

2024 was a challenging year for our church's finances. We ended the year with a deficit of £31,477. Our income in recent years hasn't kept pace with inflation and our operating costs have risen significantly.

During 2025 with careful monitoring, we have reduced some costs but there will still be a shortfall at the year end.
We need to increase our income by a minimum of £700 per month to cover our costs. Ideally, in the longer term we would hope to build up reserves to make sure major repairs can be funded in the future.

In his recent presentation to the congregation, our Minister

advised that the Church of Scotland has recently introduced stringent procedures to remove ministers from churches that are unable to meet their financial obligations.

Luckily, we are not at that stage and have time to work together to keep our church thriving and solvent. God has blessed Erskine Parish Church with a kind caring congregation that is not only generous with its money, but also gives an abundance of time and talent to do His work inside and outside our church.

David has informed the congregation of the Stewardship Campaign planned for early 2026. Everyone can help by supporting the fundraising activities, and where possible, increasing offerings and Gift Day donations by a little.



Remembrance: War Poetry


Poppies
