

Mord from Our MINISTER

September is when it all starts again. Our lives are ruled by times and seasons, which come and go, and hopeful to give us a sense of rhythm. With the marker of school summer holidays, comes a bit of a pause in many of our programs, including the church. It's a good thing, I think. I don't know about you but by summer I am usually ready to pause what I've been busily working on, and try and chase some sun and a couple of good books for a few weeks.

Ideally, this refreshes us for the next phase. But not automatically. The idea of rest now has a bit of science behind it. Apparently we need just the right amount of relaxation, with enough mental and physical

stimulus as well to really reset things. We also need to evaluate how full our 'plate' is and prioritise as we go again.

I do hope we can all support their work, and continue to be open to God's leading with how we might be part of the answer to that challenge, whether through giving, or even considering leaving a legacy. It's absolutely lovely to start this new

season with the smart new windows in the small hall, thanks to Molly's generous legacy.

Additionally, it looks like we will be welcoming a new ministry candidate as a student, and Lord willing will see another big move forward in developing local youth work for teenagers. There is so much life and activity to give thanks for. It is my prayer coming into the new term we all know God's refreshing Spirit and presence, His guidance in our time, commitment and resources, and above all that we encourage one another in the work He's given us to do in Erskine.

Property

Over the last few months the team has been working hard to keep our church in good shape and I would like to thank all members of the team for their unwavering support, time and efforts.

The Property Group would like to thank everyone who took the time to identify items that needed to be dumped during our recent clear out campaign which allowed us to do the work in a timely fashion. This exercise has cleared the stage which will allow the Fundraising Group to organise events that need space

on the stage and it has also created an area which can be used for the Youth Club which hopefully will start very soon.

I would like to update you with a list of works which have been carried out over the last few months:

Manse

- ~Replace flooring in the hallways (contractor)
- ~Redecorate the walls in the halls (contractor)
- ~Replace guttering at the front of the manse (contractor)



Church

- ~Replace the existing flooring with laminate in the Vestry toilet (team) ~Replace the w/c and wash hand basin with new sanitary ware
- (contractor)
 ~Repaint walls and ceiling in Vestry toilet (team)
- ~Continuation of planting & weeding in the church gardens (team)
- ~Thanks to a thoughtful legacy from Molly Newton we were able to replace the windows in the small hall (contractor). These windows will now be affectionately known as Molly's windows.

We have also settled our dispute with Scottish Water over the historic problem with the drains between the church and Robertson House. We have accepted an offer of 50% from them towards our costs for the work carried out investigating the foul smell around the main entrance to the church. On the back of our complaint we understand that Scottish Water carried out repairs in the main drain that runs under Robertson House so hopefully the foul smell should now be a thing of the past.

As with most church buildings the to do list never ends but you can be assured that the Property Group will continue to work hard to deliver the best we can with the funds available.



PROSTATE SCOTLAND



Supporting Prostate Scotland in raising awareness of prostate disease.

Erskine Parish Church are delighted to be supporting Prostate Scotland to raise awareness of prostate disease and prostate cancer.

Almost 1 in 2 men in Scotland over middle age will be affected by prostate disease (an enlarging prostate) at some stage in their life.

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer for men in Scotland with 1 in 10 at risk of developing prostate cancer. NHS projections suggested that in the 10-year period to 2027, the incidence of prostate cancer was set to increase by 35%.

Earlier diagnosis is vitally important as it can often lead

to successful treatment and potential cure.

Symptoms to look out for include:

- ~ Needing to urinate frequently and often with a degree of urgency throughout the day.
- ~ Having to push or strain to get urine to start to flow, sometimes experiencing an intermittent stream.
- ~ Having a weak stream and feeling that you have never quite emptied your bladder.
- ~ Having to get up 2 or more times during the night to urinate.
- ~ Having some pain when urinating or noticing some after dribble.

That said, many men diagnosed with early prostate cancer do NOT have any symptoms.

Risk factors for prostate cancer:

- ~ Age. Prostate cancer is relatively uncommon in 40's although it can happen. It becomes more common as the man ages.
- ~ Family history. Prostate cancer can run in families. A man is more at risk if his dad, grandad, Uncle on fathers side or brother has or has had prostate cancer.
- ~ If close female blood relatives have breast cancer caused by a genetic alteration e.g. BRCA1 and 2 gene, then close male blood relatives are more at risk of developing prostate cancer.
- ~ Background. Black men and those from an

African/Caribbean background are more at risk of developing prostate cancer.

~ Trans women. Can develop prostate cancer and prostate disease.

It is essential that we encourage each other to talk about men's health and to speak to your GP about a PSA test. PSA is a simple blood test but will not give a diagnosis but may point to something going wrong with the prostate.

John Malcolm, Prostate
Scotland trained Champion
said, "Every man of 50 years
and over is entitled to a PSA
test, provided he has thought
through and discussed the
advantages and drawbacks of
having a PSA test with his GP
or Practice Nurse. This is
informed decision making in
practice."

If you fit into one of the groups in the risk factor section, then it is <u>vital</u> that you inform your GP of this from the age of around 45 onwards.

Know the symptoms to look out for, but always bearing in mind that many men diagnosed with early prostate cancer may not have any symptoms at all.



It is important that women in the family, partners and wives are aware of prostate risk factors and symptoms as they can encourage men to visit their GP.

Please use the symptom checker but remember you do not need symptoms.



On Wednesday morning starting on 27th August, Toddlers will meet in the large hall from 9:15-11:30am. Please note the new time. It means that mums or who is taking a child or children to nursery or school can come straight to toddlers.

We have a large variety of toys (i.e. a large dolls house, dolls & prams, cot, a large kitchen with lots of utensils & hoovers, a play garden, see saws, a number of ride on toys, as well as 3 large sit in cars to drive and scooters. We put down carpet town mats on the floor which garages and a fire station are placed on as well as boxes with cars, a train track & a box with trains and carriages. We also put down on the floor 2 large animal mats that children can sit on to play with toys. They can press buttons to open and close lids or toys that play music. We have a registration form that needs to be filled in by an adult with a child or children they are bringing which has information about allergies. The charge per week is £3. Children have a snack of fruit or a small packet of biscuit. Adults have a cuppa & a chocolate biscuit. We also have 3 parties in the year. We hope to have new mums and also mums who already come to the group as well as grandparents and childminders. All will be made welcome!

Also, we are blessed to say that thanks to the legacy left by Molly Newton, we have been able to replace the windows in the small hall.


As a church, we were able to watch as Eileen Elder and Irvine Bain were ordained as elders.


