I don't think that is true of EPC, but I would love us to continue explore 'a conversation' with our community, learning about what makes it tick and how we can best serve it.

I'm grateful to the Listening Service and Local Mission team who already work to do this in a very literal and helpful way. When I think of my own experience, my most profound spiritual insights and leaps forward have taken place through good conversation. My prayer is that we all grow together in conversation, with each other, the wider church, and of course our local community. Its good to talk, and when we really talk, sometimes things change for the better.

## Leading Worship in YOUR Church

Who is responsible for leading Worship in the church?
The answer to that is the Minister.

In Christianity the role of the Minister is to perform functions such as, teaching of beliefs, leading services such as weddings, baptisms, funerals and providing spiritual guidance to the congregation and the community.

Times have changed over the years and with churches not having enough ministers training and filling the vacancies it has become the responsibility of Elders and members of the congregations to take an active part in worship and support the Minister.

I was a reluctant church goer and like a lot of people was a Sunday

worshiper only playing a very minor part in the church.

Several years ago, my wife and my mum along with other members of the church went to Crieff for a weekend conference each year and every year I wouldn't go even though when they came home telling me how wonderful it was.

Slowly, I began taking more to do with the church and my Faith grew to a time, along with two other members of the church I attended the Church of Scotland "Leading Worship" course.

It was a very good and interesting course over a period of 6 weeks when members of Presbytery taught us about prayers, music and delivering sermons or as I like to say talks or messages.

We are NOT Theologians by any means but it gave us the confidence to develop our own styles and delivery.

I don't think the course runs anymore, however, there is a lot of material on line in the Church of Scotland website and "Google" has come to my help on many occasions.

When Rev. David Nicolson became or Minister in October 2019 we had 9 members in the worship team, sadly since then we are down to 4 members due to ill health, people moving away and other reasons.

Having an active worship team means that we are able to continue Sunday services if the minister is ill, or on holiday or being at other churches as Interim Moderator, and it also saves the cost of Pulpit Supply which is difficult to arrange due to lack of availability.

If you had asked me several years ago to lead worship in the church, I would have laughed at you and would have been horrified at the thought of it.

Have you got what it takes to be a part of the Worship team and lead Worship in YOUR church?

If you think you would like to assist in worship in the church by doing a reading or prayers or leading services then please speak to me, the Minister or Session Clerk.

In this short period of time we have completed many of the outstanding works that had been proposed by the surveyors

in the current quinquennial report. The main jobs being painting and decorating all exterior grilles and hand rails; painting lines for 3 disabled parking spaces; drain and gutter repairs & removing unused building materials from the church roof as well as a general clear out of the cupboards and the storage area under the stage. I have attached a few photos of the team at work along with a before and after picture of the church exterior which shows the fantastic improvement we have achieved. By undertaking this work ourselves and the generous free provision of the skip by WRC Skip Hire of Inchinnan we have been able to complete this work at a greatly reduced cost.

We have started work on the outside landscaping and are currently seeking quotes for removal of tree stumps after which we will undertake some planting. The next project will be painting the hallway to the rear of the Hub and the hallway at the vestry.

We will continue to work hard into the future to help keep our church looking as good as we possibly can.

### **WATER**

For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them – Matthew 18: 20-22

Fellow believers are meant to come together, loving one another and supporting each other as we grow. Fellowship can be refreshing to a soul, just like water to a plant. It can help perk us up on a particularly draining day or quench a thirst. Water can be a vessel for the nutrients we need to grow.

### DON'T FORGET THE WEEDS!



As well as the essentials to grow we must be mindful of the "weeds" that can sprout up in our gardens, both in real life and in our spiritual life. Weeds come in all shapes, colours and sizes. The worst weed in our spiritual gardens, Satan, can sometimes be easy to spot, while other weeds like wayward friends or feelings of bitterness and anger can be hard to keep away. Weeds choke plants, creating an atmosphere where growth can be impossible. Weeds work in our lives in much the same way. They distract us from Christ as we pour all our vital nutrients into them instead of our Christian growth. Weeds can crush smaller, weaker plants easily. As we plant this garden we ask God to help us strengthen ourselves with good soil (Christ), sunlight from above (His Word), and refreshing water (fellowship with fellow believers) so that we may find ourselves with strong roots that dig into our foundation, and a close spiritual walk with our Father

## JULY






